HOMELESS MINISTRY

We have had people from several Village Groups serve alongside of the Homeless Ministry over the last few years. Once per month we go to Monroe Park to offer the people there food, clothing, hope and prayer.

Why the Homeless Ministry?

This ministry was started to care for the least of these within the Richmond metro area and to provide an opportunity to give hope and the Gospel.
